Cliff Lakes is a boat owners' club in Tamworth, Warwickshire, and also home to the largest aqua park in the midlands. It was the venue for the IWWF 2018 ProTour stop.

With Midlands Nautique providing a brand spanking new G21 and with a Nautique 210 on hand for the Groms category the scene was set for the 2022 Nautique Wake Open.

Even the weather gods were kind to us, with the sun coming out to play on the Friday practice day and the wind dropping for comp day on Saturday.

Fresh off an IWWF judging course under the tutelage of Colin Hart, Mark Goldsmith and Melissa Lock stepped into the boat with him for official duties when they weren't competing in their own categories with Mark Goldsmith designated as Chief Judge for the event. Joseph Humphries and Travis Beaton would have fared against each other, but Joe is still eligible for Junior Men crazy given his riding standard - and he took the win in that category, starting his run with his hoochie glide into orbit. And while Trav didn't show us the 900 he landed in practice, he took the win in Open Men.

In the Open Women category, Team GB's Charlotte Millward started off her season well with a great run to win.

A special mention goes to Ross and Ollie Phillips. It was a proud family moment with Ross winning Masters Men and Ollie winning Groms. Well done to all the riders and we look forward to seeing you at future competitions.
