## How are you feeling about representing Team GB in your first international competition?

As a Midlands Nautique team rider I can't wait to meet some of the International Nautique riders like Cory Teunissen and Tony Iacconi. Isabelle: I am sponsored by Supra Moomba Boats UK and I'm so looking forward to seeing Nic Rapa and Shota Tezuka ride and meeting the rest of the team. I just want to wakeboard every day so this is an amazing opportunity to do what I love with people that love it too.





What advice would you give to other young riders looking to ride for Team GB?

Charlie: Go for it, if you love wakeboarding and enjoy competing then enter as many UK competitions as you can. This will get you recognised and any ranked comp will give you points towards the overall UK ranking. This then counts towards team selection.

Isabelle: Come on girls! We need more girls riding in competition.

Work hard but always keep it fun!!

## It's both your birthdays while you are out in Italy. How do you plan to celebrate?

Charlie: There are four of us in the team who have birthdays while we are there so I guess there will be lots of celebrations. I'm not sure yet if I will be riding that day but, if so, I'll ride, support the team then probably spend some time at the pool with friends.
